

PEKIN, Oct. 26 .- The throne to-day prrendered to the Tzuchengyuan, China's national assembly, and in com-pliance with the demands of the assembly dismissed Sheng Ssuan Hual, ninister of posts and communications; rdered Prince Ching, the president of he cabinet, before a board of inquiry, where he doubtless will be severely dealt with, released from custody the president of the Szechuen provincial mbly and other leaders in the riots at Chengtu, and, in fact, agreed to all that the assembly asked, with lack of dignity inconceivable to western obervers.

A year ago the throne treated the ational assembly at times almost with ntumacy. The ministers refused to pear before the assembly, and the udget and other bills submitted to the ssembly for consideration were later but aside for others more suitable to e Palace of the Grand Councillors. Until even a month ago the throne, defiant of the people, issued edicts em-bodying drastic measures, one in Sep-tember against the anti-foreign rail-way agitators in Szechuen.
