gamente BOOSTING ASSOCIATION FOOTBALL Pilgrims of England Receive Con-

Pilgrims of England Receive Considerable Attention at New York.

New York, Oct. 18.—The visit of the English Pilgrim Association football team to America to introduce the Association game to colleges and leading athletic clubs in this country has received a big imjects at the Metropolitan Association Footbill League, which organization has elected a committee to advance the game in all of the prominent eastern colleges, with the ultimate object of establishing a big inter-collegiate league. The project will be under the patronage of the British ambassa dor, Sir Mortimer Durand, who is a keen football player and cricketer. The mambers of the committee are: D. R. James Princeton: Everett J. Wendell, Harvard; G. L. Kirby, Columbia; Julian W. Curtiss, Yale; George W. Orton, University of Pennsylvania; John G. Van Wormser, New York A.C., and James L. Sullivan, secretary of the Amateur A. A.

The efforts of the Metropolitan Foo ball League are not to be confined to college s. but will include the New York A. C., Crescent A. C. and other prominent athle the organizations in the cast.

With the organization of an intercollegiate association league, international contests would quickly follow. Six Ernest Cecil Cochrane, who is the donor of an international trophy for competition between the college teams of England, the United States and Canada, has offered a silver championship cup, valued at 100 guineas (\$525), for competition between college teams. The trophy will be known as the Intercollegiate Association Football Cup, and must be won three times before becoming the absolute property of the winner. Sir Ernest Cochrane, who salis for Engla d this morning, is very much encouraged wth the progress of Association Football in this country, and he predicts a great future for it. He expects to return to America in a few weeks.
