Question Which Council Considered Yesterday—Yonge St. Bridge Also a Matter for Discussion. The first regular business meeting of the new city council yesterday was a brief affair of two hours.

A new department with a new head should be appointed. It should be fixed first who Mr. Forman's chief should be. Controller Jones complained it wouldn't be a business proposition to hold back creating the office until there was time for squabbling as to who should fill it.
