### METHOD OF CLEARING LAND OF COUCH GRASS

Harrowing and Plowing Almost Completely Exterminated Weed.

When the land for the experimental station now located at Morden, Man. was purchased in 1915, it was found to be badly infested with couch grass (also called quack, twitch or quick grass).

In an effort to exterminate this weed 55 acres of that part of the farm which appeared to be the worst infected was reated as follows:

About the 1st of June it was plowed our inches deep and well harrowed. The spring-tooth cultivator was then used, serving to draw the roots well to the top of the ground.
