Feb'y. 17th, 1866—The committee agreed to increase the pension, under the certificates, to \$200.*

Several certificates which had lapsed for non-payment of premium in due time were renewed under a fine.

The following resolution passed;

"The Committee, having taken into consideration the request of the General Society, adhere to the opinion, already expressed, that the orphan of the late Rev. J. Woods is not entitled to the pension; but through deference to the request of the Society agree to make her an annual allowance of \$140 from the 1st January, 1866, the first payment to be made July 21st, 1866, until she attains the age of 18 years; it being distinctly understood that it will not be increased under any circumstances.

May 12, 1866—The holder of a certificate having applied for leave to reside in Bermuda, the committee gave permission under an increase of a per centage on his annual premium.
