MARKED SUCCESS OF PLAY BY AMATEURS

"A Fisherman's Luck" Admirably Presented Under Auspices of St. Peter's Y. M. C. A.

A capacity house greeted the production of "A Fisherman's Luck," which was presented in St. Peter's hall, Elm street, last evening under the auspices of St. Peter's Young Men's Association. The performance, which will be repeated this evening, is one of the best ever presented under the auspices of the association. The proceeds are for the benefit of the orphans.

"A Fisherman's Luck" is a four act melodrama, the action of which is realistic and at times quite tragic, yet containing a pleasing touch of romance and comedy. The plot is centered around Squid Hammond and his son, who are the perpetrators of many crimes.

The names in which the members of the cast handled their respective roles was a revelation to many in the audience, who did not lose sight of his frequent and prolonged applause. That the cast was well chosen was evident and all acquitted themselves in a most commendable manner.

John J. McDonnell, in the leading role, gave an excellent interpretation. His part called for a man of character and the able manner in which he handled many difficult passages won many favorable comments from the large and appreciative audience.

John U. Haggerty, William Farnes, and Squid Hammond, added to his laurels already won on the amateur stage. Although he took the part of a villain, the audience did not lose sight of his clever acting and his work was appreciated.

Frank Doherty in the role of James Hammond, son of the squib, won new honors. The character was a difficult one to portray, but he acquitted himself in a manner which was not lost on the audience.

Christopher McKensie, as Uncle David, acted naturally and won much favorable comment. He had a hard part to play, but did admirably.

Guy C. Hansen as Silas Kidder won much favorable comment for his excellent performance in a comedy role. His funny actions, wit and humor all combined in keeping the audience convulsed with laughter and he won hearty applause.

Miss Emma Conlogue played the principal feminine role with a grace and ease which won the entire audience. Although just recovering from a severe illness, she gave a portrayal which would have done credit to many in the professional ranks.

Miss Josephine Gosselin as Mrs. Manly, gave a pleasing portrayal. Her acting was natural and she shared in the plaudits.

Miss Annie Carlyn was never seen to better advantage. Although her lines did not afford her many opportunities to show her natural ability, she made much of a small part, and added to the success of the production.

Miss Minnie Carlyn, although not appearing on the programme, assisted in no small degree in the presentation of the drama. She gave a demonstration of elocution which was not lost on the audience.

Little Miss Marion Kirwin was a general favorite. She is a clever little girl and her acting was a feature.

On the whole the members of the cast did well and the many favorable comments heard on all sides gave testimony of appreciation. Rev. Peter Costello, C. S. S. R., under whose direction the production was staged, should feel proud of the success attained.

During the intermissions vocal solos were rendered by Miss Florence Kirwin, John O'Neill, William Gramman and James Duffy. It would be hard to find a better quartette of vocalists, and all were forced to respond to encores. St. Peter's Y. M. C. A. orchestra, under director Eugene McBride, rendered several pleasing selections.
