COAL DOWN TO \$3.80 CASH IN BANGOR

Bangor Commercial. "We have taken \$1.00 off the price of coal per ton in Bangor in anticipation of government regulation, and in obedience to the Federal order that retail coal dealers must base their coal prices on their September receipts," said a leading Bangor coal dealer to the Commercial Wednesday. "Coal is now \$10 a ton here, with two per cent off for cash, or \$9.80 net. "We are all at sea in regard to conditions, I frankly admit. We don't know whether we will get enough coal by water to last us through the season or not. But one thing we do know, and that is that the government imposes a fine of \$5,000 and prison on retail coal dealers who disobey the orders of the commission."

B., who had been called to this city by St. Anne's church in this city, wired the parish on Tuesday, Oct. 31, declining to accept the charge after four weeks' consideration and a great surprise to the members of the local church. A special meeting of the vestry will be held at an early date to elect a new incumbent who are said to be willing to come to Calais to fill the vacancy caused by the removal of Rev. J. Edward Hand to St. John's church in Bangor.

DESJARDINS OUT ON BAIL OF \$10,000

Montreal, Nov. 1.—Charles Desjardins, an agent employed by Inspector Giroux of the Dominion police in connection with the anti-conscriptorist agitation and the gang of dynamiters, was liberated today on \$10,000 bail. Counsel for Desjardins appealed to Mr. Justice Lavergne, suspending the order against the decision of Judge Hancock, who had refused to grant bail, with the result that bail was obtained in the substantial sum stated.
