HIGH PRAISE FOR THE CANADIANS Hostile Fire Did Not Worry Gunners CALM AS VETERANS Drivers Took Guns Into Position as if Merely on Manoeuvres—Bath a Supreme Luxury

London, March 22.—A long account of the work of the Canadian artillery is received from a man serving with them. He writes: "I am now right in the business. Our guns have been busy for nearly a fortnight. You will be pleased to hear they are performing splendidly. Firing is continuous and heavy, night and day. It has not taken our gunners long to remove any misconception which the Hun may possess in regard to the efficiency of the Canadian artillery. Everybody except those who already knew what our gunners were capable of. Not only is the marksmanship excellent, but the behavior of the men is splendid. They go about their work as calmly and methodically as any veterans. Fire from the German guns does not disconcert them in the least."

Only Move is Forward "In this campaign I do not see much of the infantry boys. They are busy holding the trenches, but I do know they have been there nearly a fortnight and have not given an inch yet, and are not likely to. I do not know what is likely to happen, nor if I did would I be allowed to mention it, but if I may be permitted to hazard an opinion I would say that when the boys do move it will be forward. So far as I am concerned, I have been in no danger up to the present, not half so much as they, ready for me, knows what might happen in that region, particularly late at night, with shells whizzing about all over the place, and I have never been near enough to disturb our slumbers, though, of course, it is no use crowding too soon."
