LONDON, Nov. 14.—Thomas Buck, of Monaton-in-Wales, Yorkshire, who has just celebrated his 102nd birthday, is an active centenarian in remarkably good health. Every day he spends a few hours in his garden, and he has just completed digging his potato crop, which he planted himself. He laid a foundation stone of a new Wesleyan chapel in the Washburn Valley, where he was born, and afterwards called on the Nidderdale centenarian, Mr. Benjamin Moorhouse, who is eight months his junior. "You cannot live to be a centenarian without plenty of fresh air," he says. "Plain food, plenty of healthy exercise, and moderation in all things—that is my recipe." He was married to his present wife at the age of 90.
