RECENT DEATHS

Phoebe Johnstone, of Halcob, southwest Miramichi, was burned yesterday when her clothing caught fire accidentally while working about a kitchen stove. Her father was sleeping in the house at the time, but was unaware of the accident.

William S. Sands, son of Mr. and Mrs. William S. Sands of Upper Loch Lomond died in the General Public Hospital yesterday after a short illness. He was fifteen years of age and leaves besides his parents one sister, Miss Bessie at home. The funeral will be held at the parents' residence at two o'clock on Sunday afternoon.

J. P. Morgan & Co have severed their connection as fiscal agents of the N. Y. & H. Railway Co. in New York. Rev. John Ellis, wanted in Boston on

a charge of kidnapping his five year old daughter, is in Tokio, Japan, according to a cablegram from the U. S. consul at Yokohama. Ellis, who is a former resident of St. Stephen, N. B., has his child with him. The identity of Ellis and his daughter was made known in Japan through motion pictures which were taken of them and sent across to that country.

Dulwich College, London, which cost about \$500,000 to build in 1870, was set on fire early yesterday morning but saved from serious damage. Suffragette literature was pinned to trees in the vicinity.

Damage amounting to at least \$4,000.00 was done yesterday in Hot Springs, Ark. in a disastrous fire which swept the business district. A heavy wind was blowing and the flames spread so that the fire departments of two cities, Hot Springs and Little Rock, up to late last night had not been able to check their course materially.

TORIES MAKING AWAY FAST WITH REVENUE

Expenditures Higher Though Income Decreased—Canada Will Have to Borrow

Ottawa, Sept. 5.—The financial statement of the dominion for the fiscal year as shown by returns entered on the books of the finance department up to the end of August gives one reason for Hon. W. T. White's protracted stay in England this summer.

The treasury is being depleted by rapidly increasing expenditures and the growth of the revenue is not keeping pace with the growth of the ministerial extravagance. Consequently the finance minister has to resort to borrowing on the dominion credit at a time of general financial stringency.

During August the net public debt of the dominion increased by \$3,881,217, as compared with a decrease of \$2,077,228 in August of last year.

The net debt now stands at \$301,750,885, as compared with \$298,068,708 at end of July.

Expenditure on consolidated fund account for the five months, ended with August, totalled \$39,428,872, an increase of \$6,077,433, as compared with the corresponding period of the last fiscal year.

Expenditure on capital account for the five months totalled \$20,215,144, an increase of \$11,219,977 over the corresponding period of last year.

The increase includes nearly eight millions in railway subsidies representing largely amounts paid on account to the Canadian Northern in conformity with the \$17,000,000 subsidy grant of last season.

Revenue for the five months totalled \$71,028,467, an increase of \$4,723,290, of which \$1,628,968 is due to increased customs collections; \$300,000 to growing post office revenue, and \$419,483 to excise representing increased production of liquor and tobacco.

Despite optimistic statements still handed out by the customs department of continued monthly increases in customs collections, the figures of the finance department for August again show a slight decrease, as was also the case in July. The customs revenue for August is given as \$8,848,721, a decrease of \$66,192, as compared with August of last year. The decrease of the last two months are the first recorded for years.

The total revenue for August was \$18,547,858, an increase of \$102,004 over August of last year. The total expenditure during the month was \$18,229,069, an increase of \$6,472,181.

The government is evidently beginning to strike its stride in regard to lavish expenditure.

MORNING LOCALS

The restaurant at Seaside Park was entered early last Wednesday morning and a sum of money taken from the cash register and a quantity of goods stolen. That the liquor sold in St. John is weak, but very slightly adulterated is the conclusion arrived at by liquor license inspector John B. Jones, as a result of the analysis made by M. Y. Padlock recently. The only adulterant found was fusel oil and this, Mr. Jones says, forms in the making of whisky.

Mrs. Annie Marr of Brunswick street, was badly hurt yesterday morning by falling off Kennedy wharf and being pinned in between a scow and the wharf. She was taken to the General Public Hospital, where her injuries were found to be internal, but not fatal.

The new fifteen inch suction dredge which has been built by James Fleming at Gregory's blocks for the Dominion government, has been completed, and was inspected yesterday by H. H. Donnelly, who said everything was in good order. The dredge may be put to work immediately on the Drumclet shoals. Captain Hanlon will be in command.

W. L. Nace, mining engineer and geologist, was in the city yesterday on his return from Albert county, where he was making an investigation of the possibilities of mining zinc from the large deposits there. American capitalists are said to be interested in the project.

His Lordship, Bishop LeBlanc will visit Goshen Corner, N. B., on September 28 and bless the new church erected there by the Catholic congregation under direction of Rev. Father LeChery. The church has been greatly admired and has been built at no little sacrifice by the priest and his people.
