NEW PENNA LABOR LAWS CURTAIL WOMEN'S WORK


Philadelphia, Nov. 19—The enforcement of the new law regulating the employment of women in Pennsylvania may result in hundreds of women losing their places in Philadelphia hotels. The main feature of the law is that no woman can work more than fifty-four hours a week or more than fifty-four hours a week or more than teniours a day; nor can they work more han six days in any one week. According to Mahlon W. Newton, president of the Philadelphia Hotel Association, the number of women thrown out of work will be at least 500 and may be much greater. Colonel Acklen, who is to serve without pay, expects to visit every section of the state, enlisting game wardens and the various sportamen's organizations in the work. 




