nations have now all successful and attractive schools in operation, it was natural that the children should prefer going there. It was therefore resolved to close the school in the meantime; and much as this is to be regretted, no other course seemed open.

One hundred volumes of the library were transferred to Mr. Diprose's School, and the amount collected during the year (\$10.20) handed to the Treasurer of the Central School.
