to continue their attendance through the higher Divisions. Hence it is unspeakably important that all our junior pupils should be sufficiently accommodated, with proper reference to the laws of health, and should be provided with the best possible opportunities for instruction.

I.—Summary of Schools, School Days, Teachers, and Attendance and Cost of Pupils, for the Year 1870,

The following summary shows the number of Schools, of days during which the Schools were open, of Teachers, and of Pupils in attendance; together with the entire cost of the Schools for the year, and the cost per Pupil.

The Number of Schools was ten (10), namely, the Palace Street, George Street, Park, Victoria Street, Louisa Street, Elizabeth Street, York Street, John Street, Phœbe Street, and Givins Street School; each of which has a separate Male and Female Department.
