- A- Yes.
- Q- You were in between Emard and DiPaolo?
- A- Yes.
- Q- According to Emard's evidence, he said that he could see the blow struck, and yet he was where?
- A- He was out in the aisle.
- Q- And where were you?
- A- I was right in there.
- Q- In between the beds?
- A- Yes.
- Q- Who would have the better view of the right hand?
- A- I would.
- Q- Who would have the better view of the left hand?
- A- I would.
