The death of James De Wolfe Spurr, one of St. John's most highly esteemed citizens, took place with tragic saddenness early Saturday afternoon in the train shed at the Union depot. The relatives of the late Mr. Spurr, although aware for some years that he was liable to be stricken by heart failure, were hardly prepared for his suddenend, as he had appeared to be in good health and spirits the evening before. Mr. Spurr's intention had been to attend the gathering of the Natural History Society held near Rothesay on Saturday afternoon. With this in view Mr. Spurr took a hurried lunch and went to the railway station to take the train for Rothesay. Soon after he had passed the gates of the train shed Mr. Spurr was ebserved to pause and lean heavily on his walking stick. He then walked a short distance farther and fell to the ground. Death was immediate. It is supposed that the unusual exertion and excitement attending the journey to Rothesay brought on the fatal attack of heart disease.
