Transport Shipped.  
The transport War Rambler shifted  
yesterday from Pettigall's wharf  
to berth No. 7 to complete her cargo.  
She sails for Baltimore, where further  
orders will be received.  
The Donaldson Line.  
The Donaldson liner Casandra sailed  
at 7.30 yesterday morning with a  
general cargo, mails and passengers.  
She was delayed through waiting for  
a completion of her passenger list  
which was made up entirely of Upper  
Canada people.  
Arrived from France.  
The British liner Fishpool, Captain  
Foster, entered the port yesterday  
from Bordeaux, France, and is lying  
in the stream. She came in ballast  
and will take on a general cargo for  
French ports.  
Finished Discharging.  
The SS Lake Coma from Havana,  
which was discharging sugar at the  
Atlantic wharves, finished discharging  
last night and was due to sail for New  
York in ballast.  
Steamships Due.  
The Imperial Oil Co. tanker Royal-  
ite, is due here today with a cargo of  
oil. She sails from Halifax. Other  
entries expected are the Furness Lin-  
er Kanawha from Liverpool by way  
of Halifax, with a general cargo, and  
the SS Middleham Castle in ballast  
from Sydney.  
Launched January 20.  
The four masted schooner, with  
steam auxiliary, which is being built  
by the Marine Construction Co., in  
their shipyard in Cherry street, is  
nearing completion and is expected to  
be launched on January 20.  
The War Monitor.  
Work on the new ship War Monitor  
which is under construction by the  
firm of Grant & Home, is well advanced.  
The deck beams have all been  
placed and the planking has been  
started. Other lines of the construc-  
tion work are also progressing favor-  
ably.  
Along Harbor Front.  
The C.P.O.S. Montserrat moved  
yesterday from No. 7 berth to No. 4,  
where she took on about 150,000  
bushels of wheat; the transport War  
Rambler moved from the Pettigall  
wharf to No. 7 berth; the SS Bank  
has moved from No. 15 to No. 2 berth  
and the Crowley, which was lying in  
stream took up the Bankdale's posi-  
tion at No. 15, where she is now load-  
ing a general cargo.  
Steamer Was Labeled.  
Mobile, Ala., Dec. 26.—Str. Fern,  
of the U. S. Shipping Board, was labelled  
on Monday by the Mobile Towing and  
Wrecking Co. for \$40,000. The vessel  
was bound and was allowed to pro-  
ceed on her way to Hog Island with  
number for the Shipping Board.  
The vessel was labelled by the  
Mobile Towing and Wrecking Co. the  
label grew out of the alleged salvaging  
of the steamer by tug Echo, of the  
Towing and Wrecking Co. The wreck-  
ing company alleges that its tug towed  
the Fern into Mobile Bay from the  
Gulf of Mexico at a time when she  
was in a sinking condition, with a car-  
go of valuable lumber on board.
