

Point of Order

and it is not helpful in the pursuit of normal debate in the House of Commons. There is all the more reason, if the hon. member wants to have some of these questions further elaborated and elucidated, that he should co-operate with the Chair and remove an obstacle to the debate in the House of Commons by withdrawing that unparliamentary expression. It is not conditional. The hon. member may not impose conditions to withdrawing his own unparliamentary expressions.

Mr. Robinson (Burnaby): I will not be a party to this travesty of justice in which the Minister of Justice is abusing his position, and Judge Berger cannot reply. Madam Speaker, indeed the Minister of Justice did indicate that the Judicial Council found—

Madam Speaker: Order. I have to warn the hon. member that he cannot enter into a debate with the Chair on this particular question. It is clear that he has used an unparliamentary expression. It is in *Hansard*. It is in the record. This is not allowed in the House. These are the rules of the House, of which the hon. member is a part. He too like all other hon. members has determined that these unparliamentary expressions should not be used in the course of debate. It is quite understandable when the debate is somewhat heated, but he knows that he cannot use that unparliamentary expression. Therefore, I have to ask him to withdraw that expression.

Mr. Robinson (Burnaby): Madam Speaker, I have no intention of making a mockery of the truth. The statement I made stands. The Minister of Justice did deliberately mislead the Canadian public on this very important matter.

Madam Speaker: Order. I cannot allow the hon. member not to follow the rules of this House. Therefore, if the hon. member is not disposed—and I will ask him another time—if he is not disposed to withdraw that expression, he knows the consequences of refusing to do that.

Some hon. Members: Hear, hear!

Some hon. Members: Oh, oh!

Madam Speaker: Therefore it is with the greatest regret that I must name the hon. member for Burnaby.
