

HOUSING SCHEMES MANY IN ENGLAND.

Practically All Municipalities Have Initiated Large Pro-jects.

The urgency of the housing question has attracted attention in all parts of England, and local authorities generally are pressing forward schemes for supplying the lack of accommodation. In few areas is the position more serious than it is in Yorkshire, where every town and even a great number of villages, have adopted various schemes. Most landlords have a waiting list of hundreds of names on their books. Good progress has been made in the provision of houses at Leeds and it is estimated that within the year 4,000 modern dwellings will be erected for workpeople at quite nodain rentals.
