An Act for the relief of certain Law Students in Lower Canada.

HEREAS certain Students at Law in Lower Canada have in good Preamble. faith, though erroneously, supposed that Articles of Clerkship are not necessary to enable those who have served three years with a practicing Attorney and taken a Degree in Law in a University or College to be 5 admitted to the Bar in Lower Canada, and have studied and served for some time under such erroneous impression, and it is expedient to afford relief to such Students by giving them the benefit of such study and service : therefore Her Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Canada, enacts as 10 follows :---
