St. Mary's will be playing the Calgary Dinosaurs, who were 34-15 winners over the Western Ontario Mustangs in the Central Bowl.

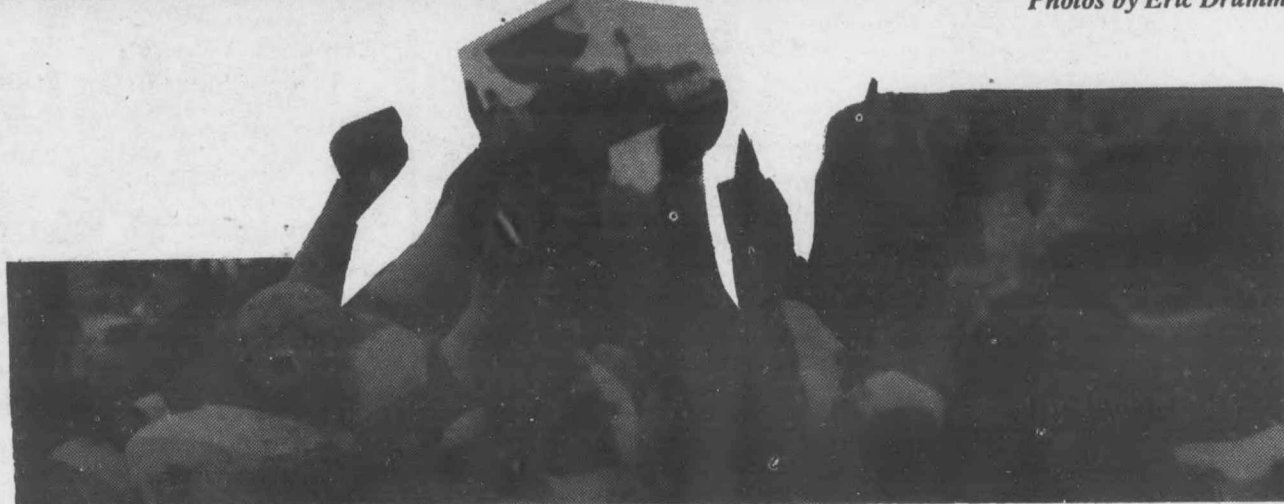
Kicker Jerry Foster booted field goals 16 and 30 yards. He converted four or five touchdowns and added two singles.

BLAZERS PICK UP 2 VICTORIES

The UNB Red Blazers evened their season record at 2-2 with a pair of victories over the Saint John Grayhounds who play in the Senior B female hockey division with UNB.

On Wednesday the ninth at the Aitken Centre the Red Blazers took a 2-0 lead on a pair of goals by Jennifer Reicker, one in the first period

December.
