

Quebec 11th June 1828

Sir

I beg to acquaint you that it is my intention to leave Quebec on Saturday the 14th Instant for Upper Canada, and that I shall only stop at York on my way up as long as the Steam Boat remains there. You will be so good as to desire Mr. Blench to be in readiness to embark with me, as I shall have occasion for his services. On my return to York I propose visiting the Credit and Neighbouring Settlements.

As the Indians from the Grand River were already summoned to attend at York to receive payment for their losses, all the necessary documents are of course in readiness.

You will be so good as to be prepared with every thing necessary for these payments when I can fix a day for going to the Mohawk Settlement, which must depend upon Information hereafter to be obtained. The Return of Indians who received Presents in Upper Canada called for by my letter of 14th Feb^r has not yet been furnished. I shall be glad if you can have it prepared on my Arrival at York.
