Alltd patrols may be aperating on the EAST side of the RHINE. Unoffical dispatches declared that patrols of the French Army are across the River at STRASBOURG.
The American First Army is in WEISTEILER thirteen miles inside Germany and 20 miles WEST of COLOGNE. There are indications that the Germans are withdrawing before our pressure on this sector. The Nazis are firing robot bombs at the First Army, supply lines in increasing numbers.
NORTH of the First Army sector the Germans have thrown in at least seven divisions against the British Second Army to recapture two towns on the muddy plains above GEILENKIRCHEN, but a LOND N dispatch says both towns were retaken later by British counter attacks.
In South Eastern HOLLAUD othe British troops are closing in on the MEURSE liver stronghold of VENLO. Unofficial estimates claim that more than forty housand prisoners have been taken in the current winter drive by the six ttacking Allied Armies.

Allied night bombers are reported in BURLIN broadcasts to have sen over the GRUNSWICK - HANOVER area last night. No confirmation has sen received from Allied sources

The midnight MOSCOW communique annouces the complete comquest the fortified EESTONIN Islands of SAARE.. This gives the Russians contraol REGA. BERLIN reports that the Russians have launched a big new offencive gainst the Germans pocketed in LATVIA

Allied planes have sunk an enemy destroyer and a transport in a embing attack on CELEBES and BORNEO. Twenty six Jap fighters and bembers re destroyed on the ground in the CELEBES raid

Polish premier STANISLEW TIKOLAJCZWK has suddenly resigned.
is is viewed in LOWDON as a set back for Anglo-American efforts to settle e Russo-Polish problem. JAN KWAPINSKI a Socialist and deputy Prime ministe s boer asked to form a new cabinet.
