After having these drinks
the juror does not remember what
he did & is not responsible for
his actions in the same way as
a normal person is. I wish to
draw the courts attention to sections
8 & 9 of chap VII of the Halk. I cannot
quote for I have not an Halk with
me - but the courts will find words
to the effect that if the mind of
a person is so affected by some
disease that he is unaware of
the nature of the crime & incapable
of forming the specific intent necessary
to constitute the crime he should
not be convicted of it. Intoxication
can affect the mind to such an
extent & if the courts consider
the evidence brought out I am
sure they will find that in this
case the mind of the accused
was so affected. In the first place
