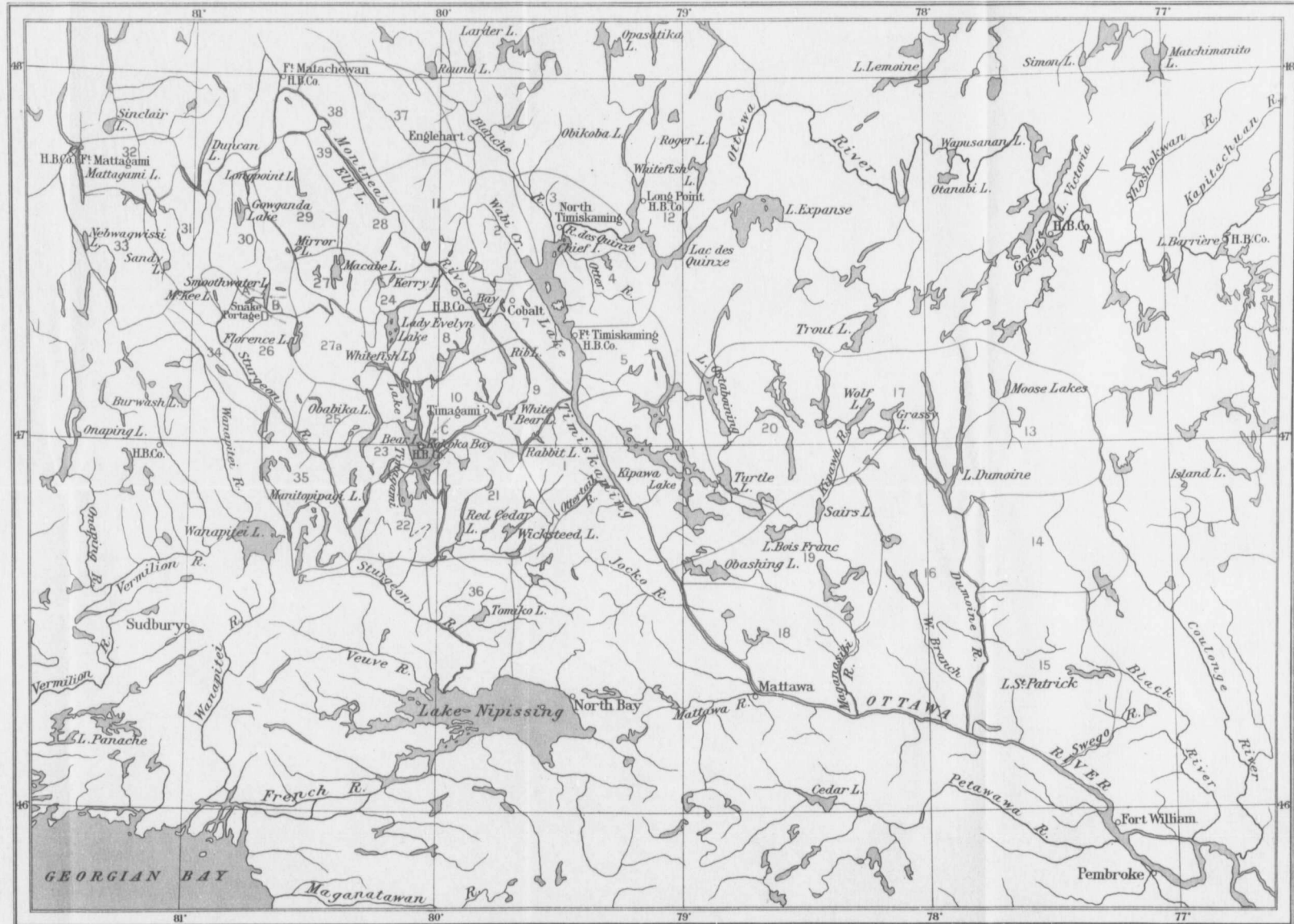

- Immediately bordering Lake Timiskaming, the territories are bounded by the shore line, leaving the islands unappropriated.

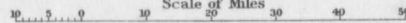
