

ONE of the most delightful sails in New Brunswick is to take the steamer at St. John, and spend the day winding in and out through the beautiful Kennebecasis river, the shores of which, especially on the north side, are high and rugged and wonderfully picturesque, till Hampton is reached, which is only twenty miles from St. John, by rail.

A few miles from St. John, after crossing into Kings County, is the beautiful little summer resort of Rothesay. Though only nine miles ride from the city, Rothesay is situated on the great Inland Basin, and is the favorite summer resort of residents of St. John.

There is at Rothesay a fine hotel, where the hosts, genial "Joc" Kennedy and his good lady, make Tourists very welcome, and at home. The hotel is situated near the depot, the service is unexcelled, while plenty of fresh berries, eggs, cream and game, in its season, make the cuisine one an epicure may well envy.

Carriage drives through every part of this charming resort may be arranged for at the hotel, and every attention is paid to the pleasure of the visitor.
