GALT, ONT.—Rev. J. M. Beiber, of Philadelphia, was in this city last week in reference to the erection of a new Lutheran church.

ST. CATHARINES, ONT.—It is reported that the McKinnon Dash & Metal Co. are considering the erection of an additional building.
