**SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST
HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.**

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Lands
in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces,
excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be home-
steaded by any person the sole head of a family, or
male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-
quarter section, of 100 acres, more or less.

Application for homestead entry or inspection must
be made in person by the applicant at the office of
the local Agent or Sub-agent.

An application for entry or inspection made pers-
onally at any Sub-agent's office may be wired to the
local Agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the
applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on
receipt of the telegram such application is to have
priority, and the land will be held until the necessary
papers to complete the transaction are received by
mail.

In case of "personation" the entry will be sum-
marily cancelled and the applicant will forfeit all
priority of claim.

An applicant for inspection must be eligible for
homestead entry, and only one application for inspec-
tion will be received from an individual until that
application has been disposed of.

A homesteader whose entry is in good standing
and not liable to cancellation, may, subject to ap-
proval of Department, relinquish it in favour of
father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, if
eligible, but to no one else, on filing declaration of
abandonment.

Where an entry is summarily cancelled, or volun-
tarily abandoned, subsequent to institution of can-
cellation proceedings, the applicant for inspection
will be entitled to prior right of entry.

Applicants for inspection must state in what par-
ticulars the homesteader is in default, and if sub-
sequently the statement is found to be incorrect in
material particulars, the applicant will lose any prior
right of re-entry, should the land become vacant, or
if entry has been granted it may be summarily
cancelled.

DUTIES.—A settler is required to perform the
conditions under one of the following plans:—

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultiva-
tion of the land in each year during the term of three
years.

(2) If the father (or mother if the father is deceased)
of a homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity
of the land entered for by such homesteader the
requirement as to residence may be satisfied by such
person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon
farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his
homestead, the requirement may be satisfied by
residence upon such land.

Before making application for patent the settler
must give six months' notice in writing to the Com-
missioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his
intention to do so.

**SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST
MINING REGULATIONS.**

COAL.—Coal lands may be purchased at \$10 per
acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite. Not more
than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual or
company. Royalty at the rate of ten cents per ton
of 2,000 pounds shall be collected on the gross output.

QUARTZ.—A free miner's certificate is granted upon
payment in advance of \$5 per annum for an individual,
and from \$50 to \$100 per annum for a company
according to capital.

A free miner, having discovered mineral in place,
may locate a claim 1,500 x 1,500 feet.

The fee for recording a claim is \$5.

At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each
year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof.
When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator
may, upon having a survey made, and upon comply-
ing with other requirements, purchase the land at
\$1 per acre.

The patent provides for the payment of a royalty of
24 per cent. on the sales.

Placer mining claims generally are 100 feet square;
entry fee \$5, renewable yearly.

A free miner may obtain two leases to dredge for
gold of five miles each for a term of twenty years,
renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the
Interior.

The lessee shall have a dredge in operation within
one season from the date of the lease for each five
miles. Rental \$10 per annum for each mile of river
leased. Royalty at the rate of 24 per cent. collected
on the output after it exceeds \$10,000.
