Priests Ejected in Franca.

Landerneau, Department of Finisterre, France, Oct. 15.—The priests of the Department of Finisterre having generally setused to quit their presbyteries, which reverted to the communes, under the church and state separation law, are new being expelled by the aid of gendarmes.
