GOOD CATCHES OF HALIBUT IN NOVEMBER
Prince Rupert, May 2.—Although there has been stormy weather in Hecate Straits, the halibut catches maintain a good average, and trawling has also kept up well. Tuesday the C. F. & C. S. steamer James Carruthers arrived with 120,000 pounds of halibut in her hold. The previous day the trawler G. B. Foster, with a trawl of 32,000 pounds, docked.
Independent boats in since last night include the Sadie K. with 14,000 pounds of halibut, the Lanning with 4,000, Nuba, 5,000; Guilford, 12,000, and Nautilus, 2,000. Halibut quotations were 10-13 today.
The salmon boats, selling last evening, were the Max, 600 pounds, and the Mary 5, with 1,600. The fish brought 11 cents.

U.S. ARMY OVERSEAS
NOW BEING REDUCED
Paris, May 2.—The American expeditionary force will be reduced solely to the army of occupation along the Rhine as rapidly as possible, it was announced today.
Three hundred thousand American soldiers will be sent home during May and June, and in June, after July 1 the use of the French ports will be abandoned. American-controlled railroads returned to France and American and military police withdrawn. Antwerp will then become the American supply base.
Roughly \$4,000,000 worth of orders have already been booked in Europe by Canadian woolen manufacturers who formed a trade group, as advocated by the Canadian Trade Commission. Other groups are now being rapidly arranged.

WILL LOOK AFTER SOLDIERS' GRAVES IN FRANCE

War Graves Commission of British Empire Recognized by French Government.

Ottawa, May 2.—Hon. N. W. Rowell, President of the Privy Council, tabled in the House of Commons yesterday afternoon the copy of an agreement between the British and French Governments respecting the British war graves in France. The agreement recognizes the Imperial War Graves Commission as the only British authority charged with the care of British military graves in France.

The second article of the agreement deals with removal of bodies interred in isolated cemeteries to military cemeteries. The third article provides that bodies interred in cemeteries or in military graves shall not be exhumed for transport to the United Kingdom or any other part of the Empire without the approval of the Imperial War Graves Commission. The French Government undertakes to instruct the Prefects to refuse all applications, for permission for the removal of bodies unless preferred through the Commission.

Ottawa, May 2.—A memorial in the new Parliament Building for Colonel G. H. Baker, the only member of the Canadian House of Commons who was killed in the war, was proposed to the Senate yesterday by Senator Foster.

Senator Foster moved that Senators Bradbury, Cassin, Pope and himself be appointed to confer with the Committee charged with the construction of the new building. Senator Dandurand heartily concurred in the proposal and suggested the Committee might consider the advisability of adding to the memorial the names of members' sons who had sacrificed their lives in the war.

The motion was adopted.
