### France Will Not Yield a Point.

Germany Must Fulfill Her Obligations--Irish Affairs to be Settled Before General Election--Prince Albert to Wed English Beauty.

#### POINCARÉ'S POLICY.

PARIS, Jan. 19. Raymond Poincaré, President of France, during the war, and now Minister with the French Chamber of Deputies unanimous approval, served notice on Germany that so long as he held office he would not fulfill the obligations entered upon at Versailles, and expect no leniency. "The Versailles Treaty binds us to our Allies, it binds Germany to us and it is carried out," he said. Those are his final words before leaving office after replying to various questions. His pronouncement ended up the whole programme of Government.

#### NO ELECTION YET.

GLASGOW, Jan. 19. The Chamberlain Government is in the House of Commons, and dispelled any idea of an early election by telling the members of Scottish Unionists that the Government had decided that until the establishment of the Irish Government and its equipment were completed there would be no thought of a general election.

#### WILL PUBLISH CHINESE TREATIES.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 19. Pushing towards the conclusion of its labors the Far-Eastern Committee to-day recorded mutual pledges against discriminatory railway practices in China, and then gave general approval to the treaty and the whole multitude of treaties and understandings relating to Chinese interests be published to the world. The suggestion for a show down of all Chinese commitments came from the United States and received the tentative endorsement of British, Japanese and French delegates.

#### FORESHADOWS COAL STRIKE.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 19. Secretary Hoover declared to-day that the stage appears to be set for a general strike in the bituminous coal industry at the end of March when existing wage contracts expire.

#### MACKENZIE KING OPPOSED.

OTTAWA, Jan. 19. Thirteen members of MacKenzie King's Cabinet were elected by acclamation to-day. The Premier himself is opposed by J. Armstrong, defeated Conservative candidate in the same riding in the elections last December. All Maritime Provinces and Quebec Ministers were returned unopposed.

#### RESPONSIBLE FOR HIS WIFE.

MONTREAL, Jan. 19. By the judgment of the Superior Court to-day a man is held jointly responsible with his wife if the wife sells liquor without a license from premises where he is presumed to be domiciled, no matter if he is aware of the infraction of the Quebec Liquor Act. James Ingram, a sailor, was sentenced to one month in prison while on the high seas because his wife sold liquor. On his return he was sent to prison and applied for habeas corpus on the ground that he has not been tried, but the Superior Court sustained the sentence.

#### GIVEN EXAGGERATED IMPORTANCE.

BELFAST, Jan. 19. In view of the retirement of Field Marshal Sir Henry Wilson as Chief of the Imperial Staff, significance is attached to statements made to-day by Premier Craig of Ulster. Add dates to the oatmeal cookies. Add halved marshmallows to the fruit salad. Grated cheese is an addition to onion soup. Drawn butter is good with cornmeal spoon bread. A gelatine is an excellent dessert for a heavy meal. A dry sponge will remove the lint from clothing. Garnish the croquettes of veal with fried parsley. Delicious jam may be made from figs and dried apricots. Garnish toasted cheese sandwiches with grape jelly. Shrimps are excellent fried and served with tartare sauce. Custard cups make excellent molds for the jellied salad. Chopped peanuts and celery make a delicious sandwich filling. A cold sore may be healed by rubbing on it melted butter. A pinch of grated nutmeg improves cream of celery soup. In making a white cake, substitute two egg whites for a yolk. Strips of green and red peppers stewed are nice served with fish. Baked bananas are good served with currant jelly or lemon sauce. After the flour sack has been emptied, open the bottom to remove a possible cupful. A shirtwaist box stood on end and fitted with shelves makes a good little cupboard for hats.

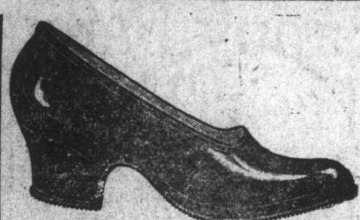
