The market for the week has been very slack.

deliveries of all kinds of grain having been lighter than usual. Of Fall Wheat there is scarcely any offering, and the price is steady at our quotations. Spring Wheat is the principal grain brought to market, and even of that the receipts are comparatively light. The price has slightly advanced to-day, but it is scarcely probable that the advanced rate will long be paid, as there is no increase i demand in other market to warrant the rise here. It is a result of the same cause to which we attributed a slight increase of price last week, namely, to local requirements. Owners of mills who want to keep them running pay a little more than those who are buying for shument; but bewond this than usual. Of Fall Wheat there is scarcely any to keep them running pay a little more than those who are buying for shipment; but beyond this there is no reason why wheat should sellhighertoday than it did a week ago, for the Montreal, Toronto, New York and Chicago Markets are dull and drooping. Indeed, some of the buyers are not very eager to purchase at \$1.40. Of barley there is but little offering, and the price has gone up two cents a bushel. Peas coming in slowly, with no advance in prices. Of cats there is scarcely ahy offered, and there has been no change in price for two weeks. Pork is offering freely, and finds good demand at from \$4.50 to \$5.
