



The Governor-General in London. His Excellency, the Governor-General and the Countess of Dufferin left Toron. to on Thursday morning for a brief visit West. They were accompanied by Col. and Lady Harriet Fletcher, Hon. A, Mackenzie, Hon. A. McKellar, &c. The party went by special train on the Great Western Railway, which stopped a few inutes at Hamilton, Paris and Woodtock. At the latter place a large cor

Notes. At the latter place is large con-course of people were gathered, and the nation was handsomely decorated. Ad-dresses were presented by the Town and County Councils. The train arrived at Lcudon at half-past one. Here great preparations had been made for the reception of the Gov-ernor.General and party, who were loudly cheered on their arrival. At the station the Mayor read the address of the cor-poration, and the Beard of Tradé also presented an address. Afterwards a pro-cession was formed to convey the vice-regal party to the fair grounds. The streets of the city all bore signs of rejoic-ing. No less than four trimphal archès. had to be passed before the ground was reached. During the procession the Lof-don Field Battery, under the command of Col. Shanly and Capt. Peters, fired a sulute, and the bells of St. Paul's Cath-edral rang out merrily. Inside the ground an enormous crowd were waiting to welcome Her Majesty's Representative. As soon as the carriages entered the gates, hearty cheers rang from the mul-titude, and it was with difficulty that any progress could be made through the con-course. Their Excellencies were conduct-ed to the Judge's stand, in the centre of the ring, and the President of the West-em Fair Association, Mr. W. Saunders, presented Lord Dufferin with an address.
