

"We are opposed," he said, "to having a small percentage of labor men run the entire laboring class in a high-handed and authoritative manner. As now constituted labor unions cannot long stand. Either they must reform themselves or they will cease to exist, as they are now unfair and unjust, and the honest workingman cannot long be subjected to oppression without rising in revolt.

"I want every one of the 300 ministers here to accept this as his creed and preach it. I am stating the position of the Methodist Church today at this conference, as the members of the church do not seem to be disposed to state it themselves. I want the statement to be published broadcast, so there can be do doubt gree of internal strength as to the attitude of Methodists toward honest labor. I believe this should become part of the creed of every Protestant church."
