The Governor directs the publication, for general information, of the following Dispatch from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, on the subject of Confederation with the Dominion of Canada.

British Colonist.—Downing Street, No. 34, 14th August, 1869.

Sir,—In my Dispatch of the 17th of June, in which I communicated to you your appointment to the Government of British Columbia, I informed you that I should probably have occasion to address you on the question then in agitation of the incorporation of that Colony with the Dominion of Canada.

You are aware that Her Majesty's Government have hitherto declined to entertain this question, mainly because it could not arise practically till the Territory of the Hudson Bay Company was annexed to the Dominion, but also, perhaps, in the expectation that the public opinion of British Columbia might have opportunity to form and declare itself.

I have now to inform you that the terms on which Rupert's Land and the North West Territory are to be united to Canada, have been agreed to by the parties concerned, and that the Queen will probably be advised before long to issue an Order in Council, which will incorporate in the Dominion of Canada the whole of the British Possessions on the North American Continent, except the then contentious Colony of British Columbia.

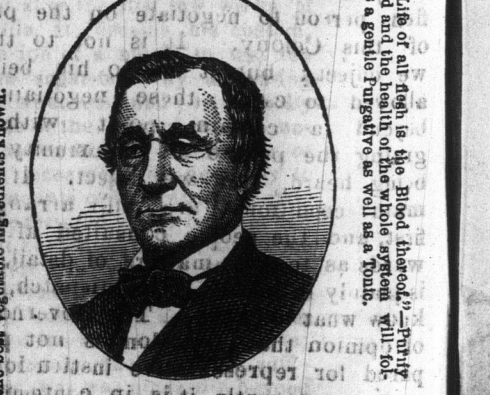
