

OSGOODE HALL NOTES.

The Mimico Gas Works are shut for weeks.

Mr. Winchester on Saturday made an order striking out part of the statements of defence in the selection action of Johanna Daily against John Byram. The plaintiff is married a second time, and it is contended that her daughter by the first marriage, who was seduced, was not the plaintiff's daughter.

Judgment was reserved on a motion before Mr. Winchester for immediate judgment in the action of L. F. Pugh against William Parsons, G. Harris, James A. Wright, William Sharp, James Barrett and Thomas McDonald. The defendants employed the plaintiff, a Pennsylvania gentleman, to come over and work on the farm at Mimico, but now refuse to do so.

At the trial of the case of the Queen's Bench Division a petition against the return of the writ of habeas corpus was granted on Saturday afternoon by Mr. Justice G. G. Green. The writ was granted in favour of the petitioner, and the return of the writ was set aside.

At the annual meeting of the Medical Council of the Province of Ontario in addition to taking charge of the college and all medical students who are under their examinations, he was consulted for the county of York for a number of years and commenced the Canadian Detective Agency under the name of Watson and Wason. Subsequently he carried it out night patrol and the name of the Detective Agency, acting as agent for Pinkerton of Chicago, and doing a great deal of work for the banks and private corporations. The Committee on Administration will confer with the Toronto Junction authorities as to the proportion of the cost of justice and administration to be borne by the town. Permits were granted to lay its tracks across Yonge-street at Bedford-street and St. Clair-avenue. Another business was despatched, and then the council adjourned to meet again in November.

The annual convention at Trinity College this year is fixed for the 28th inst. On the evening of the 27th there will be a choral service in the chapel at 8 o'clock, when the sermon will be preached by the Rev. Arthur Lloyd, M.A., headmaster of Trinity College School, Port Hope. The gentlemen selected for honorary degrees are the Ven. Archbishop of Toronto, the Hon. J. M. Woodworth, chancellor of the Diocese of Ontario, and the author of a book on the "Place of the Cathedral in an American Church," which also is admitted to the degree of D.C.L.
