The greatest event of the day was the free for all. In the pools the Maid sold at \$400 to \$320 to the field. The maid led through the first heat, passing the wire in a walk. It was evident after the first scoring that Lula was amiss. She acted very badly, breaking very often. Previous to the second heat the Maid sold at 2 to 1. In the third heat Lula had the advantage of the start, but the Maid passed her on the turn and kept the lead to the end; though she broke once or twice on the last quarter. Lula acted worse than ever in this heat, breaking, and losing so much time that she was distanced. The Maid's victory caused the wildest excitement. This may be her last appearance on the turf, as Budd Doble thinks she has won her retirement. The whole meeting of the Association has been a brilliant success.
