The coustant growth of all the Def artmente entuils corresponding increase of expenditure, for freo grants of Literature, travelling, printing, atationery, and offee oxpenses. This, together with increased Diocesan work, will cause a deficit at the end of the year of several hundred pounds.
Beyond this, help is urgently neaded for the following-at lowest ostimates:

1. Towarda organizing secretaries for the four Wolnh Diocerer, $£ 600$.
2. Help [norely needed] for other poor Dioceses, $\mathfrak{f} 650$.
3. Present expenses and four ad ditional polico conrt missionaries with expenseн, $£ 600$.
4. To improve and extend tho circulation of the Socie'y's literatare, and to make free grants of tho same to Coloniul and poor parishes; also to the seumen of our merchant ships, $£ 650$.
5. Present expenees and two additional army arents [for London, and Dublin] £300.
6. To oxtend the work of the Society by the Juvenile Union and the Agricultural depart ment, $£ 500$.
7. To apread Temperance, among the 14.000 cabmen, and 11,000 busmen of London, $£ 200$.
Frosh annual income required, $\pm 3500$.
Further capital for the Publication departm't imperatively needed [on this interost is paid punctually at 5 per cent. per annum], $£ 500$.
The total making $£ 4.000$.
So that the Executive ought to have at the lowert estimate, without delay, $£ \pm, 000$, if the work of the Society is to have a fair chance of making progress.
The Archbishop of Canterbury recently spoke of the C.E.T.S. ats "this rational and offoctive Socio ty." and again in "most readily giving his testimony' to "the excelience of the Society's work," said "The work of the Church in promoting Temperance hat greatly advanced the causo of religion in England, and has endeared the Church of England to the poople."
W.S. Caino, Frq.. M.P., nals :"I am a Nonconfurmist, and I wieh to seo tho Church of England disestablished, but it has done more to postpone the day of disestablishment by its Tomperance work than by any other to which it erer put its hand. It has made the Church 'the Church of the People,' in a sense in which it never bas been before.
