The constant growth of all the Departments entails corresponding increase of expenditure, for free grants of Literature, travelling, printing, stationery, and office expenses. This, together with inpenses. This, together with in-creased Diocesan work, will cause a deficit at the end of the year of several hundred pounds.

Beyond this, help is urgently needed for the following-at lowest estimates:

1. Towards organizing secretaries for the four Welsh Dioceses, £600. 2. Help [sorely needed] for other

poor Dioceses, £650. 3. Present expenses and four additional police court missionaries with expenses, £600.

4. To improve and extend the circulation of the Society's literature, and to make free grants of the same to Colonial and poor parishes; also to the seamon of our morchant ships, £650.

5. Present expenses and two additional army agents [for London, and Dublin] £300.

6. To extend the work of the Society by the Juvenile Union and the Agricultural department, £500.

7. To spread Temperance, among the 14,000 cabmen, and 11,000 bus-

men of London, £200. Fresh annual income required, £3 500.

Further capital for the Publication departm't imperatively needed fon this interest is paid punctually at 5 per cent. per annum], £500.

The total making $\pounds 4.000$.

So that the Executive ought to have at the lowest estimate, without delay, £4,000, if the work of the Society is to have a fair chance of making progress.

The Archbishop of Canterbury recently spoke of the C.E.T.S. as "this rational and effective Socioty." and again in "most readily giving his testimony' to "the ex-cellence of the Society's work," said "The work of the Church in promoting Temperance has greatly advanced the cause of religion in England, and has endeared the Church of England to the people."

W. S. Caino, Erq., M. P., says :-"I am a Nonconformist, and I wish to see the Church of England dis-established, but it has done more to postpone the day of disestablishment by its Temperance work than by any other to which it ever put its hand. It has made the Church 'the Church of the People,' in a sense in which it never has been before.


