

3. Temporary Entry (Non-Immigrant) Visas issued to *bona fide* students, nationals of either country, proceeding for a regular course of study in either country, may be made valid for a period of one year, subject to renewal, provided the conditions required by the competent authorities of the country of sojourn are fulfilled.

4. A Transit Visa shall entitle the holder to the rights given by such a visa in accordance with the relative conditions in force in the country for which it is issued.

5. In doubtful cases the authorities requested to grant a visa shall have the right to make preliminary application to their Government for authorisation to grant the visa.

6. Each of the two Parties reserves the right to make any alterations to the above mentioned system that they may eventually find necessary, provided that they give the other Party reasonable notice of their intention.

7. The present arrangement will come into force, for each of the two Parties, on the thirtieth day following the date on which the Embassy will be kind enough to inform the Ministry of its consent.

The Canadian Embassy is pleased to advise that this procedure for the granting of visas for Canada and Turkey to the nationals of the two countries has been accepted by the Canadian Government. It is agreed that the Ministry's Note No. 32740-4 of the 15th of February, 1949, and the reply of the Canadian Embassy shall constitute an agreement to this effect, and that this arrangement shall come into force on the thirtieth day following this reply, as provided by paragraph 7 of the procedure stated above.

The Canadian Embassy takes this opportunity to renew to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs the assurance of its very high consideration.
