PRICE OF GASOLINE

Mr. McDermid: I am pleased to announce that this afternoon a further 2 cent per litre decrease has been passed on to retailers by Petro-Canada. That amounts to a total drop of 6 cents per litre, approximately 27 cents a gallon, in the last month and a half.
