The said Bill was read for the first time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Aikins. it was

Ordered. That the Forty-second Rule of this House be dispensed with, in so far as it relates to the said Bill, and that the same be read a second time presently.

The said Bill was then read a second time ac ordingly.

Ordered, That the said Bill be referred to the Committee on Standing Orders and Private Bills.

A message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk, to return the Bill intituled : "An Act to authorize Joseph Meunier to build a Toll Bridge over the River L'Assomption, in the Province of Quebec."

Also the Bill intituled : "An Act respecting Carriers by water."

And also the Bill intituled "An Act to incorporate the Neutral Link Railway Company," and to acquaint this House that they have agreed to the amendments made by the Senate to these Bills without any amendments.

The House according to order was adjourned during pleasure, and put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill intituled: "An Act further to continue for a limited time the 'Insolvent Act, 1869,' and the Acts amending the same."

After some time the House was resumed, and

The Honorable Mr. Kaulbach from the said Committee, reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same with certain amendments

(Vide Journal.)

Ordered, That the said amendments be now received.

And the said amendments being read a second time were agreed to.

On motion of the Honornble Mr. Scott, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Penny, it was Ordered, That the said Bill be read a third time presently.

The said Bill was then read a third time accordingly.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered. That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, to which they desire their concurrence.

The House according to order was adjourned during pleasure, and again put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill intituled : "An Act to impose License Duties on Compounders of Spirits ; to amend the "Act respecting the Inland Revenue," and to prevent the Adulteration of Food, Drinks and Drugs."

After some time the House was resumed, and

The Honorable Mr. McClelan, from the said Committee, reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same with certain amendments.

Ordered, That the said amendments be now received.

And the said amendments being read a second time were agreed to.

The Honorable Mr. Scott noved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. McClelan,

That the said Bill, as amended, be read a third time presently.

The Honorable Mr. Kaulbach moved in amendment, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Recsor

To leave out all the words after "Bill," and insert further amended as follows ;
