Dear Sir, Recognizing that the live stock industry was suffering losses because of animal parasites and that no adequate effort was being made in Canada to study this menace or to deal with it, we decided to undertake investigational work at Macdonald College, which, as you may know, is the agricultural college of this University. The work was begun in 1928, when it was placed in charge of a committee composed of members of different departments interested in this field of study and in a position to participate in it. We have been able to enlist the interest and financial support of the National Research Council of Canada and also the interest and financial support of the Empire Marketing Board. Working in conjunction with both these bodies and with the Department of Agriculture of the Province of Quebec, we are now building at Macdonald College a research institute for animal parasitology. The building will be completed in April. We are very anxious to secure the services of a good man to be Professor of Animal Parasitology and to act as Director of the Institute. On the recommendation of Dr. H.M. Tory, Chairman of the National Research Council, I wish to offer you the position, and I hope you will be able to come to us.
