THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL SD-239.

An Act for the relief of Ivy Elizabeth Sherry.

Preamble.

Whereas Ivy Elizabeth Sherry, residing at the city of Verdun, in the province of Quebec, wife of Henry Edward Sherry, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Montreal, in the said province, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the fifth day 5 of May, A.D. 1946, at the said city of Verdun, she then being Ivy Elizabeth Jacques; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, on the ground of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage is hereby dissolved, and 15 shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.
