of June Iaft, fo unhefitatingly declare that they confider it " to be *fufficiently liberal*," and as the parties concerned (those of them meaning that have feen the Regulations) are gratefully fatisfied therewith; fo much fo at leaft, that the Governor has heard of no inflance where the parties would not infinitely rather pay the additional fees for the fupport of Government, than wait longer in ruinous uncertainty and fuspences If there fhould be any inflances of that fort, the parties might certainly be left to their own option in that respect.

If the Board do not think proper to advife any other mode for making the Regulations more fpeedia ly and generally known to the Partics concerned, the Parties may probably content themfelves with that mode which His Majefty has commanded, by having recourfe to Public Records where His Majefty has gracioufly directed His Inftructions to be entered for their information and fatisfaction.
