" For without holiness no man can see the Lord ;" and we are assured " that no unclean thing can enter the gates of the New Jerusalem," and that neither " thieves, nor extortioners, nor the covetous, nor the effeminate, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor idolaters, shall inherit the kingdom of God."
