WEST TORONTO.

Interesting Budget From the Big Western Ward.

WEST TORONTO, Aug. 17.—(Special.)—The funeral of the late William Brown, who died Tuesday afternoon, will be held tomorrow afternoon at 4 o'clock, to Prospect Cemetery. Deceased was a machinist, working at 203 St. Clair-avenue, and was employed by the Canada Cycle and Motor Co. He died of acute indigestion after an illness of six months. His home was in England, all his relatives and friends being on that side of the water, and his fellow-workers in the motor works are providing and directing the funeral.

Victoria Presbyterian Church has completed the purchase of the house and lot to the north of the church, on Midland-street, from Mr. T. A. Rhodes, the owner, at a cost in the neighborhood of \$6000. The church directors feel that this is an ideal site for the erection of their proposed new church, for which a \$60,000 campaign was carried on a few weeks ago. The lot is a large one, having 60 feet frontage on Midland-street. It was originally owned by the church several years ago.

The death occurred to-day of Mrs. Eliza J. MacWilliams, at her home, 26 Boreford-avenue. Deceased was 61 years of age and leaves a husband and three sons. The funeral takes place Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock, to Prospect Cemetery.

The time is coming, and that before very long, when some definite action will require to be taken dealing with the regulation of automobile traffic along all the suburban roads leading out of the city. Whether in the shape of a tax or in some form, but some it must be.

The trouble now is not so much with respect to the speed of these things, but the injury caused along the most frequented roads to the small and large fruits belonging to the people unfortunate to live along any highway save the Kingston-road, where these machines have full swing.
