FINANCES SUFFER. The Military Fever Now on in England Has Put Markets in a

State of Stagnation, fering from an acute spasm of military dementia, a disease to which modern empires seem particularly liable. The consequence is that financial business of all kinds is suffering from a bad setback. Whereas during the seven, first mouths of the year new joint stock undertakings were poured on the market every week in scores, now none at all appear of the slightest importance. In the process prices dwindle and we are in danger of a crisis from inanition unless the cloud lift soon. In short, until this wretched wrangie with the Boers is settled, one way or another, our public cennot even be persuaded to buy American rallroad stocks.

A Thousand Acres of Tea Destroyed and General Damage Done

Belgrade, Sept. 25.-The court this morning rendered judgment in the case of prisoners who have been on trial for some time oners who have been on trial for some time past charged with the attempted assassination of former-King Milan of Servia, July 6, when he was shot at by a Bosnian nared Knezevic. Knezevic and Paisitch, the leaders of the conspiracy, were sentenced to death; the others were condemned to 20 years' imprisonment. One of the accused was sentenced to nine years' imprisonment and seven were condemned to five years' imprisonment. Six of the men on trial were acquitted. Knezevic was shot publicly this afternoon in the presence of a large crowd. After the sentences were read, Paisitch was informed that King Alexander had pardoned him.

VETO APPROVED OF IN LONDON.

"To District Olicer, commanding No. 2 District—General officer commanding does not approve of 48th Highlanders taking part in celebration of Admiral Lewey's victory over a power triendly to the British Empire. (Signed) Chief Staff Officer."

Although it was chilly weather for klits, and all ranks knew that the trip was practically off, there was a good turnout, about 500 strong, at last night's special parade, and the evening was spent in company and battaino drill. The men expected that Col. Cosby would address them, but were disappointed. After parade many unkind things were said about the Major-General as the soldiers stood around in groups and discussed the situation. The unkind remarks emanated from all ranks in the bitterness of disappointment.

Col. Cosby said to The World that the regiment would parade as usual next Friday night unless the order from Ottawa was countermanded. Should consent yet be given for the New York trip, then special orders will be issued regarding Friuay night's parade.
