SWARMING INTO CANADA.

Chicago Paper Views Situation as It
Appears in the Northwest.

The following timely matter on Cana-
dian growth is from The Chicago
Record-Herald, which has been devoting
much place to the western problem
of late.

It is now being seriously questioned
whether the Canadian Northwest is
quite prepared to receive the vast
army of settlers which is now pouring
into that part of the country. The
rush to Canada from the Old Country
and European colonies is now pouring
into that part of the country.

The common announcement made is
that there is plenty of room in the
west for all who may choose to come
in. A careful analysis of the present
situation shows that upward of 1,000,000
persons are likely to arrive in Canada
by the first of November, exclusive of
arrivals from the United States. Home
and fuel have to be supplied to these
new settlers, and Premier Haultain of
the territorial government sees danger
ahead for the people. He has looked
carefully into this aspect of the mat-
ter, and cannot understand how the
railways, with their present equipment,
are going to carry in sufficient lumber
and fuel to satisfy the needs of so
many newcomers. It will require 400,
000 homes for 2,000,000 persons, and an
enormous quantity of lumber and fuel
needed to build so many houses in the
prairie country.

"We are entirely dependent," said
Mr. Haultain, "upon the railways for
our supply of food, and coal has to be
used extensively, as there is no wood
whatever. Even with our present
population there has been considerable
scarcity of coal, and the situation ex-
posed how sufficient will be procured
when many thousands of new homes
are to be supplied. The only solution
is in the railways taking immediate
action."

In regard to the immigration problem
from Great Britain, a difference has
just arisen between the Canadian
government and the British govern-
ment, which goes to show the pre-
sent temper of the Canadian people
upon the subject of Canadian citizens
taking part in the foreign wars of
Britain. Arrangements were about
to be completed to allow the British
government to send Canadian citizens
to fight in the Canadian Northwest,
but these arrangements have been
cancelled, and are now likely to
fall through by the action of the Imperial
War Office. The British government

government to provide the reservists
