

Baseball in Toronto Win Again

NOTE AND COMMENT

Old country papers of the day following the 17th of March show that the fight followed had a pretty good run for their money, even if some did pay as high as \$125 a seat. There were four battles, including the short go between Burns and Roche, and all were good except the main event.

Tommy Burns sends us the "burn" edition of The Dublin Mail, in which appears his own story of how he won. It was one of the greatest days in the history of the old Irish capital, judging from the two pages given over to the scrap by The Dublin Mail.

Burns says his right-hand blow that scored the knock-out only traveled six inches. Also, "I wore the American flag as a waist-belt, and I want to reiterate that, though born in Canada, I am an American citizen, and have proudly worn the American flag in all my fights on both sides of the Atlantic."

The first preliminary lasted ten rounds, the second 15 and there was also another at 15 rounds that came after the main event. There was an orchestra playing martial airs. In the centre of the stage a square ring had been roped off, and chairs were placed round this on three sides, leaving the fourth open to the view of the audience. It was a strange gathering, that, occupied these stage seats. Here, cheek by jowl, were noblemen and pugilists, sporting professional men, army officers, battered followers of the "noble art," and loud-voiced, self-asserting gentlemen of the betting-ring.

A little after 10 o'clock the master of ceremonies appeared in the ring and made the conditions of the fight, and at 10.10 Roche went into the ring, the orchestra playing "The Boys of Wexford," and the audience cheering wildly. A minute later Burns followed, the band striking up "Yankee Doodle." Both men were some time in undressing.

Roche had the best corner, as his back was to the powerful electric lights. He appeared the easier of the two, and was smiling all the time his seconds were adjusting the gloves. When he was stripped he looked very heavy, much more so than Burns, who was also pale to sallowness, and his inflamed eye gave him an ugly appearance. The Irishman wore dark green trunks with light green bands, and Burns had on dark red trunks with a Stars and Stripes sash. He wore fire-resistant dogskin gloves, but Roche preferred bandages.

Mr. Watson, the referee, having called the men into the ring and cautioned them the going went at 10.29 o'clock for the first and last round. Both men adopted their characteristic attitude, Burns with a high guard moving round the Irishman with beautiful foot work as they feinted and fussed for an opening. Roche feinted with his left, and later tried a left hook, but Burns was much too quick for him. A few seconds more manoeuvring and Burns again feinted.

Roche retreated, but was too slow and Burns shooting his right hand fast on the cheek bone, the Irishman half turned, and went down like a log with his face to the boards. He made several efforts to rise, but the going before he was able to face his opponent again. The round had only lasted 1 minute 28 seconds, and, therefore, the fight was the shortest on record for the championship. Burns immediately offered to go on, but, of course, referee at once declined, and declaring Burns the winner, ordered the men out of the ring.

The four members of the syndicate who had promoted the gathering were Messrs. Richard Croker, D. O'Connell, Myer, Martin Fitzgerald and E. B. Healy. They hung up \$100 for two of the preliminaries, a summary of which read:

Fifteen-round contest at 9 stone—Private Berry (11th Hussars) beat W. Hook, London, knock-out in the tenth round 225 a side and a 150 purse. Fifteen-round contest, at 11 stone 4 pounds—Private Warner (3rd Dragoon Guards) beat Bombardier Morgan (Royal Garrison Artillery), decision for a side bet and 150 purse, was an interesting one.

Thirteen-round contest (catch weights)—Pedlar McMahon (Cardiff) beat Billy Morgan (Swansea); knock-out in eighth round. A most exhilarating battle, if an unscientific one, both men going to work with a will and the hitting was fast and furious.
