

Numerous brilliant offers reached him from foreign countries, but he refused them all in order to devote his science and activity to the university of his native town.

"Humanity is not only indebted to him for his discoveries in surgical treatment of goitre but also for the many lessons he drew from his experiences and observations in other more complicated diseases.
